Our high expectations of all of the children in our care directly impact upon the standard of our children's behaviour and outcomes.



Cheadle Catholic Junior School serves the parishes of Christ Church, St. Chad's, St. Ann's and parts of St. John's and St. Vincent's. The work of the School is conducted in accordance with the Rites, Practices and Observances of the Roman Catholic Church. We expect that all children admitted to school will take a full and active part in the religious life of the school. Parents wishing to withdraw their child/children from religious instruction and worship, in accordance with the provisions of Section 25 of the 1933 Education Act, must make arrangements with the governing body.


Religious instruction is given according to the doctrines and practices of the Catholic Church. A programme called 'The Way, the Truth and the Life' is used throughout the school, as recommended for all schools in the Shrewsbury Diocese. It takes full account of the age and development of the children.


Our parish priests are in close contact with the school and they lead our regular celebrations of class and school masses and penitential services. Children share fully in preparing and celebrating the liturgies. A programme of assemblies involving year groups and whole school take place each week during which children play an active role. Our Year 3 pupils are supported in preparation for the sacrament of First Holy Communion, which takes place at parish level.

About our school

Cheadle Catholic Junior School is a three form entry junior school with 360 pupils on roll. It is set on a large, shared site with Cheadle Catholic Infant School overlooking fields and trees of Bruntwood Park giving it a truly rural feel.

We have a huge field, garden and outdoor learning areas for the children to play and learn about the world around them.





Rights Respecting School



We are a UNICEF Rights Respecting School and are working towards the gold accreditation.

Our children explore the articles on the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, which are embedded in our school's policies, practices and ethos.

Outcomes for pupils

Pupils leave our school with strong outcomes; Key Stage 2 (SATs) results are consistently above national averages and pupils make good progress from their starting point.

We are committed to every child reaching their potential and staff are skilled in making adaptations to support all children in their learning journey.







Pastoral Support

At Cheadle Catholic Juniors, we are committed to ensuring the well-being of every child so that they are healthy in Mind, Body and Spirit. A number of years ago we developed a well-being team of professionals to encourage children to talk about any worries, develop resilience in dealing with problems and nurture positive self-esteem and relationships.

Emotional Well-being is at the heart of the Whole School Curriculum and that it is tailored and adapted so that all children have access to it. This can be through one to one sessions, whole-class PSHE lessons and curriculum, Rainbow groups with a small group of pupils and whole school initiatives including Mental Health days, assemblies and exciting projects.

We have a lead Emotional Wellbeing Practitioner trained in counselling skills and supports children in many ways including regular sessions, drop-ins and play/ art therapy.

Behaviour

At Cheadle Catholic Junior School we are proud of the fantastic behaviours for learning of the children. We follow consistent approaches to behaviour management and ensure that all children are treated equally.

We follow a restorative approach with childrenunderstanding the consequences of their actions on themselves and others. We praise children for working and behaving well and address less desirable behaviour quickly, usingit as a learning strategy for the child. We believe that all children should be treated as individuals.

We keep parents informed about behaviour and believe that working together is key.

Inclusion

We are an inclusive school and strive to meetthe individual needs of each pupil in our care. Our teachers plan work / programmes that ensure each child makes progress from their starting points, providing appropriate and adapted teaching techniques and learning resources where necessary. Our Sendco supports teachers, children and parents with all aspects of special educational needs.

Outside services and agencies support us in ensuring that your child has specialist provision where a need has been identified.





PE and Sports

We are part of the Stockport SHAPES alliance and, in addition to specialist PE teaching, participate in a wide range of sporting festivals, competitions and experiences.

The Years 3-5 PE curriculum includes swimming, with children having lessons at Life Leisure Cheadle.

Outdoors and environmental education

Extended Outdoor Learning Provision is a key focus of our school improvement work this year and going forwards.

We are committed to developing our outdoor learning spaces to support curriculum development. We are currently working towards Live Simply Award inspired by Pope Franics Laudato Si. We are aiming to become more sustainable by extending our garden to include an allotment.

Music and performance

Supported by the specialist teaching of the Stockport Music Service our music curriculum is a real strength of the school.

Every child across the school learns to play a musical instrument as part of their music lessons and all are given the opportunity to perform in a year group production.

Stockport Music Service provides peripatetic music lesson, in a number of instruments.



Extra Curricular Opportunities

Our curriculum is enriched by a wide number of additional opportunities including a range of after school activities across the year.

These include gardening, art, coding, performance, football, netball and multi-sports.



Wrap Around Care

It is the aim of the Cheadle Catholic Junior School Wrap Around Care to provide a safe and secure environment for children of parents who need reliable child care. Our school ethos is at the heart of our provision and in our care, children will have the opportunity to relax, join in with indoor and outdoor activities (weather permitting), do homework, play and just have fun.

School meals

The government does not fund school meals at Key Stage 2 so parents should pay for meals using our online system, ParentPay.
