 Here at Cheadle Catholic Junior School, we build upon the Read WriteInc(RWI) programme used at the Infant School.

This is a sequenced and structured synthetic approach to teaching phonics, with writing aspects included.

How does it work?

Children:


- Learn 44 sounds and matching letters/ letter groups
- Learn to blend sounds to read words

Learning to identify sounds (phonemes) and blend them together is called decoding.

All words are made up of sounds

Graphemes


- A grapheme is a sound written down

Building on Foundations in Year 1 and Year 2


- Most children will have completed the RWI phonics programme by the end of Year 1.

- Those still not secure by the end of Year 2 are supported with targeted intervention work into Year's 3 and 4.
