# Year 3—Mary, the Mother of God.

"Mary the Mother of Jesus and therefore the Mother of God is the first disciple...She is the Church's model of faith and charity and because of her singular response to God's Word is Mother of the Church." Religious Education Curriculum Directory



The children will learn that God called Mary to be the Mother of Jesus and learn how Mary responded to God's call. They will learn the 'Hail Mary' and begin to understand what the words mean.

They will learn that Advent is a time to prepare for the coming of Jesus at Christmas and begin to understand that Christmas is a celebration of the birth of Jesus, the Son

of God. They will also learn about the stories of the shepherds and the wise men's visit to see the baby Jesus.

At home you could help your children by:

- · saying the Hail Mary every day
- · talking with them about the importance of Mary in Jesus' life

### Year 4 - Trust in God



The children will learn about Jesus' teaching and the importance of trusting in him. They will learn that it is not always easy to trust in God (e.g. Zechariah). They will learn about the promise God made to Mary through the angel Gabriel and learn how Joseph put his trust in God when the angel appeared to him. They will become familiar with Mary's song of praise and trust in God (the Magnificat) and learn that God fulfilled his promise to Mary when Jesus, the Son of God, was born.

The children will have a chance to deepen their awareness of God's love for us and know that he asks us to trust in him. They will reflect on the times it is difficult to trust and on the importance of keeping promises. They will make their own Advent promises. The children will reflect on how Mary and Joseph placed all their trust in God and experience a celebration of the Nativity.

At home you could help your children by:

making an Advent calendar with them

## Year 5—The Commandments



The children will learn that God loves us and calls us to be in a relationship with him. They will learn that God gave Moses the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai because he loves us.

The children will understand that the Ten Commandments are a gift from God to help us. They will learn how Jesus summarised the Ten Commandments (Matthew 22: 36-40) and begin to understand how we can show our love for God by keeping his commandments with his help.

The children will also learn that God sent his Son Jesus into the world because he loves us and that we celebrate this gift at Christmas.

# Year 6—Justice

The children will learn that God called the prophets from the Old Testament and learn about the different ways they responded. They will learn that the prophets spoke out against injustice and that some prophets were persecuted because they spoke out.

They will learn that Christians are called to work for justice and find out about individuals who have been persecuted for speaking out against injustice.

The children will learn that Advent is a time of waiting and hoping for the birth of the Messiah at Christmas and understand that the birth of Jesus fulfilled Old Testament prophecies.

At home you could help your children by:

- thinking about how your family could support the work of CAFOD
- visit <u>www.cafod.org.uk</u> to learn more about CAFOD and its work in the developing world
- include an intention for people fighting injustice in your prayers with the children.

#### Extra news since the last newsletter:

It has been lovely seeing so many parents, grandparents and other family members come and share and participate in class liturgies. I am sure you will agree how beautiful and spiritual our class liturgies are, and how hard the children work to plan them alongside their class teacher.

Each class will have the opportunity during Advent to reflect about the importance and true meaning of Christmas. To assist this, your child will bring home a miniature crib and a little tea light, with a little prayer to say together as a family. Your child can then write a short prayer which will be shared the following day with their class during prayer and liturgy sessions.

Our year 3 and 4 children enjoyed their Prayer Friend Mass, held at Christ Church. Thank you to Fr Tony, the Parishioners of Christ Church and the parents and members of staff who assisted that day. It truly was a memorable experience for the children particularly as it is the start of their journey preparing to make their First Holy Communion. Our Prayer friends also enjoyed exchanging cards and spending some time with each other as they get used to being part of the Junior School family.
